Dear Members of the Missouri General Assembly,

In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the State of Missouri and national opioid settlement administrators, please find the Second Annual Report on Opioid Settlement Funds. Missouri's MOU, Section F, Number 42, requires each recipient of settlement funds to provide the General Assembly with a report detailing the following for the preceding year:

1. The amount of settlement funds received;
2. Details on how settlement funds were spent; and
3. Whether each expenditure fits within an approved use.

The MOU also requires this report to be published on the state's website. The website established for this purpose, and for the public reporting of opioid settlement funds as required by individual settlements, can be found at: <https://moopioidsettlements.dmh.mo.gov>.

The Department of Mental Health is the lead agency for reporting opioid settlement expenditures. The department continues to work with the Missouri Attorney General's Office, the Missouri Association of Counties, and the Missouri Municipal League on settlement tracking. An updated report will be distributed annually, each March, for the preceding calendar year.




- Settlement payments to the State of Missouri began in April 2021.











- 13 local governments received settlement funds for the first time in 2024. 77% (10 out of 13) did not spend settlement funds during 2024.











Section 196.1050, RSMo, established the Opioid Addiction Treatment and Recovery Fund, into which all monetary proceeds are deposited for the State of Missouri's share of settlement distributions.

Website

The Department of Mental Health has developed a website dedicated to reporting and tracking opioid settlement funds distributed to the State of Missouri and its political subdivisions. The website is accessible to the public and will provide annual distribution and expenditure information for the State of Missouri and all reporting local governments. Annual information for the prior calendar year will be updated every March, for the duration of settlement distributions.

The website provides direct, online reporting capabilities for all state agencies, counties, cities, and political subdivisions to submit annual expenditure data.
